# MULTILOBE TRANSPOSITIONS; TECHNIQUES FOR MORE AESTHETIC AND FUNCTIONAL CLOSURES IN BILOBES, TRILOBES AND QUADRILOBES.

Introduction: Multilobe transposition flaps are a useful and aesthetic closure in certain locations in head and neck skin cancer reconstruction. However, they can lead to dysfunction and unaesthetic results if not planned and executed correctly.

Observation: The author will demonstrate from his resource of many hundreds of multilobe transposition flaps, rules to follow and pearls to improve the final result. This presentation will focus on the nose but demonstrate the approach to their best execution on other areas of the head and neck.

Key Message: our understanding of multilobe transpositions has changed since the classic modern description of the bilobe by Zitelli.
