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DERMOSCOPY AND SKIN IMAGING

"NAIL-LIKE APPERANCE"- CHARACTERISTIC FEATURE OF HAIR FRACTURE CAUSED BY HAIR DYE UNDER DERMOSCOPY

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Background: The reddish-brown amorphous plaque that ressemble excoriated lesions on the scalp and the similar color of surrounding dyed hairs highly indicated the diagnosis of hair fracture caused by hair dye.

Observation: A 39-year-old-woman cousulted us for neatly-broken hair after redyeing her hair on forehead margin of the scalp with a 1-day history. The broken ends curled slightly downward under polarized light, analogous to nails used in construction, which serve as a diagnostic clue and has not been observed in previous dermatoscope. This was further confirmed considering the absence of high-temperature perm history and should be in differential diagnosis from tinea capitis and trichotillomania. Three months after washing off the hair dye, the newly grown hair was erect.
