



SKIN CANCER (OTHER THAN MELANOMA)

A RARE COMBINATION OF MULTIPLE TUMORS ARISING FROM A NEVUS SEBACEOUS: CASE REPORT AND LITERATURE REVIEW

Background: We report a case of a 52-year-old female who presented with multiple tumors arising from multiple nevus sebaceus on her head and face and right neck.

Observation: Pale yellow plaque was on the right side of the face, covered with crusts, yellow plaque was on the forehead and nose, with dense pale yellow papules, nodules, and clear border. A brown verrucous plaque on the occipital shows pink new organisms, soft and well defined. Dark brown verrucous plaque appear on the right neck, with clear boundaries and numerous brown papule. Histopathological examination of five different areas: (1) Neck: nevus sebaceus combined with trichoblastoma; (2) Face: nevus sebaceus combined with papillary cystadenoma, sebaceous adenoma and basal cell carcinoma; (3) Eyebrow: nevus sebaceus combined with papillary cystadenoma and focal regional basal cell carcinoma; (4) Frontal (hairline): nevus sebaceus combined with papillary cystadenoma and trichoblastoma; (5) occipital: nevus sebaceus combined with papillary cystadenoma.

Key message: Prophylactic excision of nevus sebaceus is strongly advocated at puberty due to the increased risk of malignant transformation with time.
