## GORLIN-GOLTZ SYNDROME: A CASE REPORT

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Background: The basal cell nevus syndrome, also known as Gorlin-Goltz syndrome, is an autossomal dominant disorder that occurs with the development of basal cell carcinomas and other clinical and radiologic findings like odontogenic keratocysts, palmar and plantar pits, calcification of de falx cerebri and skeletal malformations. Medulloblastoma and other tumors can also be find. The point of this repor is that the early diagnosis, appropriate treatments and secundary prevention are decisive to improve the patient's life.

Observation: In the presente case, the authors describe an adult patient with multiple basal cell carcinomas having spread through the body over 15 years.
