## THE PONCET-SPIEGLER CYLINDROMA OR TURBAN TUMOR: A HOLE SCALP INVOLVEMENT, CASE REPORT.

Introduction: The Poncet-Spiegler cylindroma (PSC) is a benign annexal cutaneous tumor which preferentially develops on the scalp, neck, or forehead. Localizations may be isolated or multiple and often affect the young adult. The lesions grow progressively. When the scalp is completely involved, it presents as a turban tumor.

Observation: A 73 year-old male patient with a 50 years history of developing multiple tumors on the scalp was first assessed by the dermatologic team on 2014. The treatment were multiple surgical exeresis with second hand healing. Follow-up was uneventful with a progressive functional and cosmetic improvement and after 3 years, there was no relapse.

Discussion: In case of turban tumor, multiple surgical interventions with healing by second intentions is and option for aged patiens. And periodic follow up in order to prevent relapse
