



DERMOSCOPY AND SKIN IMAGING

GENITAL LESIONS

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Pigmented genital lesions have recently been the subject of numerous studies focusing on their clinical and dermatoscopic characteristics. The incidence of these lesions is about 10-12% and may be underestimated, given the peculiarity of this anatomical site. Pigmented lesions of the genitals must therefore be considered as "difficult lesions", which do not meet the classical ABCD criteria for cutaneous melanoma. However, recent advances in dermoscopy have proven helpful for the differential diagnosis between benign pigmented lesions and malignant melanoma.
